What does the 300 word count relate to?

The 300 word count relates only to the abstract document template and includes the headers that are provided within the template. It does not include elements such as the title, themes and author/affiliations.

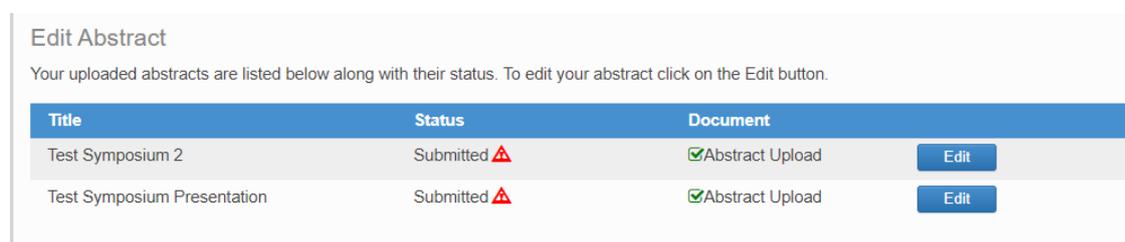
If you have an abstract account already set up, email iassidd2024@in-conference.org.uk and we will send you an auto login link for the abstract submission portal.

If you have not already registered your interest for IASSIDD 2024 or started the abstract submission process, we will not have your details on file and you would need to use the portal to add your contact details. The system for IASSIDD 2024 is completely separate from the membership system. Please note that your record from the last Congress in 2019 would also not be carried over, as this is an entirely new event.

Even though I had submitted my abstract, I can see a red triangle next to my submission on the portal. Why is this?

The red triangle indicates that you can still edit your submission, which you can do so up to the point that the portal closes. Please don't be alarmed – as long as it says submitted, and you received an email to say so, your abstract will have been submitted with no issue.

Can you provide further information on the posters?

Posters will be displayed on poster boards alongside the exhibition area, and there will be dedicated poster viewing sessions across all four days of the congress. Further information on the dimensions of the posters will be communicated to those who are accepted for a poster presentation.

Do all presenters need to be in-person or is there an option to present virtually?

All accepted submissions require at least one presenter to attend the conference in-person to present, regardless of whether it is an oral, symposium, poster presentation or a round table discussion. There will not be the option to present virtually.

For the symposia, is there a requirement for there to be four presenters, or is it ok for a presenter to present more than one of the four presentations?

It is fine for symposia presenters to present more than one presentation – as long as there are four presentations in total.

Is it allowed to submit an abstract of a research article that will be published in a journal?

Yes, this is permitted.

The guidelines state that oral presentations should be novel work not previously published, is this the same for poster?

The guidelines have since been updated to clarify that both formats should be novel and previously unpublished work.

Can round table discussions be based on previously published work?

Round Tables that draw on previously published work would be very welcome – they are a great way to promote discussion around work in the public domain.

I can't seem to add more than three authors, why is this?

There is a limit on the number of presenting authors (people who will attend the conference and present the paper), however there is no limit to non-presenting authors. Therefore as long as you don't tick presenting for the remainder, it should allow you to add more.

If a symposium proposal is not accepted, will the individual symposium presentations still be considered?

If the symposium presentation is not accepted, the individual symposium presentation submission will be considered on their own merit and will be considered for an individual spoken word presentation or a poster presentation.

For the symposium proposals, do I need to include the authors for all of the presentations in my submission?

When you are submitting the symposium, the overall symposium proposal and the four symposium presentations are submitted separately. This would mean that for the symposium proposal, the authors would essentially be the organisers. Then when each of the four symposium presentations abstracts are submitted separately, this is where you would add who the authors and presenting authors are for each one. You would not need to add their details into the proposal for the symposium itself.
